<u>The Team</u> There are 6 classes in Team Māhuri: 4 x composite Year 5/6 classes and 2 x Year 4 classes.

Classroom programme

We have a fantastically busy programme planned for Term 1. Inquiry: Ko wai au: Who We Are, Science: Electricity and Magnetism Numeracy: Number Knowledge, Addition/Subtraction, Problem-solving

Literacy: Writing Revolution, Paragraph writing

PE: Camp fitness, Invasion games, swimming sports, cross-country training

The Russley Values will continue to be a major focus for Māhuri and across the whole school, as all our work will filter through the dispositions of: Hauora (Healthy), Manaakitanga (Respectful), Whānaungatanga (Team player), Auahatanga (Creative, problem-solver). Through these dispositions, we will continue to have an increasingly more collaborative, integrated team that will enable us to provide much greater flexibility in groupings, activities, and approaches to the curriculum to meet individual learning needs. It's going to be an exciting year with lots of opportunities for the kids to establish positive learning habits, work with a range of teachers and peers, and become self-directed learners.

Year 5/6 Woodend Camp
