# Principal's Message

Tēnā koutou katoa. Nau mai hoki mai ki te kura Te Parito Kōwhai Russley School. Kia Orana to Russley's Cook Islands Māori families who are this week celebrating Cook Islands Māori Language Week - Epetoma o te reo Māori Kūki 'Airani.

#### Value focus — auahatanga

This term, we are focused on the value of **auahatanga (o-aha-tongue-a)**. The graphic represents the two hemispheres and four sections of the brain. The brain plays a crucial role in creativity and problem -solving.



Auahatanga inspires my curiosity, bravery and love of learning. It helps me be innovative and resourceful when solving problems. I learn to take risks, think creatively and explore different solutions. By encouraging perseverance and offering new perspectives, auahatanga helps me to adapt to new situations and challenges with confidence.
