

Camp 2026

All Russley children in Years 5-8 next year will go to camp in term 1. Teams Köhure and Māhuri will both be going to camp for two nights from 25—27 March. Year 5/6 to Woodend, and Year 7/8 to Hanmer.



Teachers estimate that camp will cost \$260 per child. The full amount must be paid prior to departure.

Families that find the cost a challenge may wish to set up a direct credit of \$5—10 per week. Small deposits, starting now, would put families in a good position to have paid the bulk of the cost by the time camp comes around.

Keeping Ourselves Safe



Keeping Ourselves Safe Programme (Years 0 - 8)

As part of the health curriculum, all classes will take part in a personal safety programme, Keeping Ourselves Safe, in term 4. KOS is a comprehensive child protection programme in which students at all levels learn and apply a range of safety skills that they can use when interacting with others.

Keeping Ourselves Safe has three overall aims:

- to develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people;
- to support and encourage children to get help from caring adults;
- to make teachers and parents more aware of the need and ways to keep children safe from other adults and children.

Children will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk, for example walking home alone in the dark;
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people;
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules;
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused;
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse.

Children will know:

- that abuse is never okay;
- that abuse is never their fault.

We encourage parents to support their child by talking with them about what they are learning at school. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child to use their new skills with confidence. Before the programme begins, we ask parents to have a look at the information in this <u>Keeping Ourselves Safe presentation</u> as an overview of what the programme covers.
