## Camp 2026

All students in Years 5—8 will go to camp in term one 2026. Teams Köhure and Māhuri will both be going to separate camps for two nights on 25—27 March. Year 5/6 to Woodend, and Year 7/8 to Hanmer Springs.



Teachers estimate that camp will cost about \$210 per Year 5/6 student and \$260 per Year 7/8 child. Fees must be paid in full prior to departure. For families that find the cost a challenge, we suggest that parents set up an automatic payment of \$10 per week which would put them in a good position to have paid the bulk of the cost by the time camp comes around.
