#### Principal's Message

Tēnā koutou katoa. Nau mai haere mai ki te kura Te Parito Kōwhai Russley.

#### Rebuild update

After looking at an empty area for the past month where the old hall and Rooms 14-17 used to be, we believe the Ministry of Education and Hawkins Construction have reached an agreement on their contract. We should see physical work beginning in the coming week or two which is exciting for the next phase of the rebuild. The next phase is extensive, with a new block of 8 teaching spaces, the removal of Rooms 10-13, the old library and ESOL room, the creation of new courts and playing space and finally the complete redesign of the Cutts Rd school entrance. It really will look quite different.

Term 1 value focus

This term's value focus is hauora. The new tile design represents a whare; a meeting house with four walls. The four walls are required to support the house. Each of these walls represents an aspect



of hauora or health. Taha hinengaro represents mental health and emotions, taha wairua represents spiritual health, taha tinana represents physical health and taha whānau represents family as a key part of everyone's health. All aspects need to be present and balanced for us to maintain overall health and wellness. If one of these is missing or not balanced, our 'house' (us) leans and isn't stable.

#### Cellphone policy

As mentioned in the last newsletter, we are required to formally adopt a cell-phone policy that ensures students' mobile phones are 'away for the day' whilst at school. This is not a big change because that is pretty much what we do now. However, I am seeking feedback on this policy from our school community before finalising it.

This is a summary of our current practice:

- Cellphones that are brought to school must remain in students' bags or by agreement with the teacher.
- Phones are not to be accessed during the school day.
- Any breach of this creates a warning, handing in of the phone, and/or follow up with parents.
- We expect all student/parent communications to come through the school office e.g. messages, illness notifications, appointment arrangements

- The above expectations do not apply to BYO devices, such as Chromebooks, being used for learning purposes.
- The school assumes no responsibility for any loss or damage of any personal device that is brought to school.

Year 8 School-based Vaccination Programme — Friday 22 March

A vaccination pack has been provided to Year 8 students who have not completed their vaccinations in General Practice. This year's school-based vaccination programme offers two-dose HPV vaccinations to protect against genital warts, cervical cancer, throat and mouth cancers, and other types of cancers later in life. The programme also includes a Boostrix vaccination to provide protection against Tetanus, Diphtheria and Whooping Cough. Parent/caregivers are asked to please complete the registration form and return it to school by **Monday 26 February**. Consent for the school-based programme can be withdrawn at any time during the programme by contacting the vaccinating team directly at HPV@cdhb.health.nz

#### Science Awards—register by 1 March

Te Parito Kōwhai Russley School is once again offering students in Years 4-8 an opportunity to earn Science Awards - an optional homework activity designed by the Science Awards Trust.

Year 4 students complete a series of science activity sheets designed for them to work on by themselves. Progress is monitored in a sticker booklet. Recommended 4-6 weeks per activity sheet. The cost per student is \$6.

**Year 5** Explorer Badge and **Year 6** Advanced Explorer Badge offer a range of extension activities and skills. Students must complete eight activities from four categories. Cost per badge is \$6.

Years 7 and 8 Students purchase an activity sheet from a range of 30 science topics. Once completed, a badge and certificate are awarded. Students have all year to complete a badge and may complete more than one if they wish. Cost per badge is \$6.
