Some background to Easter Tuesday for schools

I heard some chat over the weekend about why Easter moves around and why schools sometimes have an extra day's holiday, so here follows a little detail. Easter is a Christian celebration determined by the first spring full moon in the northern hemisphere. The Easter weekend is the first weekend after this moon. In New Zealand, a Tuesday school holiday was added to the Education Act back in 1954 and it has remained ever since.

Easter 2025 (in school holidays) - April 18 Good Friday, April 21 Easter Mon-

Easter 2026 (in school holidays) - April 03 Good Friday, April 06 Easter Mon-

Easter 2027 will be even earlier than this year, with March 26 being Good Friday, March 29 Easter Monday and March 30 Easter Tuesday for schools.

Bus Fares Increase

For students who travel to school by bus, please be aware that from 1 May, 5-12-year-old's will no longer travel for free on public buses following the government's changes to its Community Connect concessions scheme. This is a nationwide change, decided by the new government. Children 4 years old and under will continue to travel for free without a Metrocard.

Children 5-12 will need to top up their Metro cards to cover the \$1 bus and \$2 ferry concessions as part of the half-price Under-25 concession from May 1. Council had already planned for the continuation of the Under -25 concession in its 2022/23 Annual Plan, as part of its flat fare trial.

All other Metro concessions for Greater Christchurch will remain the same including Community Services Card holders, tertiary students, and Total Mobility customers.
